## Guidelines and Procedures:

### General information:

- We will follow all guidelines and procedures recommended by the CDC, the State of Georgia, the Chattahoochee Council, and all municipalities within our council.
- All units will be expected to follow the procedures and guidelines outlined to ensure a safe and successful experience for all involved and ensure they have adequate BALOO trained leadership to accompany their Pack.
- Please be respectful of ALL volunteers & follow their directions.
- Make sure ALL parents and leaders know not to park in front of, besides, mobile home on premises.
- There will be NO onsite registration.
- Each pack will have a round robin schedule to limit the number of participants in each area; please follow your schedule. Failure to follow your schedule will create a bottleneck at activities and we want all youth to have adequate time at each station.

### Check in Procedures:

All participating youth will receive a wristband at check-in. Check-in location will be at the front of the bathhouse from 7:00-9:00 A.M.

Wristbands **MUST ALWAYS BE WORN!** The color of the wrist band will coordinate with what event rotation your unit is on.

**Vehicles WILL NOT be authorized to drive to or in campsites at all during week one or week two.** This includes arrival and departure. Each pack will be authorized to drive one Pack trailer to camp sites for download of all gear and equipment if trailer becomes unhitched for the weekend the vehicle towing will need to be brought back to parking lot. **PLEASE HELP US ENSURE EVERYONE KNOWS THIS AND THIS WILL BE ENFORCED BY PARK RANGERS. YOU MUST ARRIVE BEFORE DUSK ON FRIDAY IN ORDER TO DROP YOUR TRAILER AT YOUR ASSIGNED CAMPSITE. NO TRAILER DROPS WILL BE ALLOWED ON SATURDAY.**

We will have 4 pull wagons available to help get items to your campsite. We encourage campers to bring their own pull wagons for ease of transportation. Any other transportation arraignments will need to be coordinated with the Camp director prior to this event.

T-shirts and hoodie pre-orders will be distributed to **Leaders Only** during leaders meeting Saturday morning (time and location will be announced on GroupMe) then leaders will pass them out at campsites.

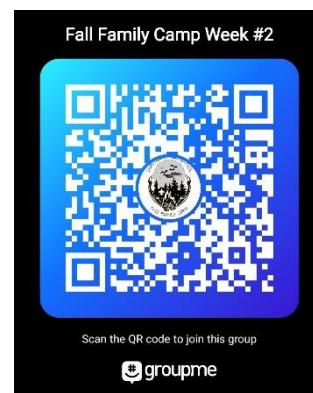
## Communication:

## Camp Procedures & Rules:

- Promote good hygiene, wash, and sanitize hands regularly.
- Each unit is expected to treat their campsite and all camp property like it is their own and keep it clean. Leave all areas better than you found it, or better.
- All trash must be taken to the large dumpster, not the bath house upon departure and periodically during camp.
- No food or Coffee makers are allowed in Bath House, no exceptions!
- CAMPERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO WASH ANY DISHES IN THE BATH HOUSE. EACH UNIT SHOULD USE THE THREE BIN METHOD OF CLEANING CAMP GEAR. PLEASE USE THIS LINK TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH THE THREE BIN METHOD OF CLEANING.

- **Absolutely no Alcoholic beverages on camp property.** If caught you will be told to leave and possibly not return to future events.
- A Scout is Clean - Pack campfire etiquette must be Scout appropriate, meaning please refrain from using vulgar, crude, or explicit language and music.
- No animals or pets are allowed on camp property. Animals and pets are not part of tours or activities in Scouting. Service Dogs are allowed with proper documentation.
- The gates to Camp Pine Mountain open at 4:00 PM EST.
- Any damage to camp property by your unit will result in forfeiting your site deposit.
- Closed toe shoes must be worn at all times. Absolutely no flip flops or open toe shoes of any kind may be worn to walk around camp property. Please consider a closed toe shower shoe when using the showers.

## First Aid:

- Each Pack is responsible for providing their own first aid kits at their assigned campsites. There will be a designated first aid kit located at the bath house for emergency purposes.
- Should an emergency arise that requires immediate attention, please alert your Cubmaster and call 911 if necessary. Please also notify the camp director via Remind app.
- All people in attendance at camp are required to bring their Scouts BSA medical form parts A&B.

## Sleeping Arrangements:

- Cub scouts must sleep with their families in their assigned camp sites while attending family camp.
- Families are highly encouraged to camp overnight but are not required. Families can leave after activities are complete.

## Campfire Guideline:

- Units are responsible for fire watch and all fires will never be unattended.
- Local fire ban status will be updated daily located near the bath house. **Will be enforced.**
